Appeal

The building that housed Nepal National Library at Hariharbhawan, Lalitpur was damaged and marked with red sticker after 2015 Gorkha earthquake. As the building was found to be unsuitable for library operations, effort to get own land to construct building began once again. After long exercise and continuous struggle of library professionals finally, the dream came true with the decision of Council of Ministers dated 14th September, 2018 which allocated land for constructing new NNL building at Jamal, Kathmandu. After owning the land ownership certificate of land at Jamal, NNL proceeded and completed preliminaries many essential for constructing modern library representing building arts, culture and architecture of Nepal. Unfortunately, after reaching last phase (e tendering) to construct the library building, Council of Ministers decided not to continue any activities for library building on 20th July, 2020. Many organization and stakeholders requested government

to withdraw the decision through social media and various other print and online medias. Similarly, a group of renowned 59 intellectual groups appealed to Right Honarable Prime Minister and Council of Ministers to clear the path to continue the construction of previously decided library building. The original translated appeal is as follows:

Libraries and museums prominent place where the glorious saga of history are preserved and conserved. Most of the countries of the world have recognized such bodies as the guardians of civilization and culture as institutions of national interest. Unfortunately, the fact that the Nepal National Library, established in 2013 B.S., does not have its own building which can be taken as proof that the state has not paid enough attention to the protection and promotion of such institutions in Nepal. Harihar Bhawan, which inhabited library for very long, got collapsed after the 2015 earthquake

however, the important documents has been preserved with the special interest of the Right Honarable Prime Minister that important documents including books should not be stored in a closed room for a long time. The people of the country expressed their gratitude to the Right Honorable Prime Minister for receiving the news that it has reached the final stage to build the 21st century library building as the Government of Nepal provided almost 8-ropani land at Jamal to the Nepal National Library with Land ownership certificate through the decision of Council of Ministers on 14th September, 2018. Though the drawing design, detailed project initial environmental report, examination, drawing design approval and dismantling of old buildings at Jamal were completed the meeting of the Council of Ministers dated 20th July, 2020 decided not to construct the library building. In response to the news, various sections of the civil society have demanded Prime Minister to

rectify the decision to suspend the construction of the library building and we intellectuals heartily appeal to pave the way for the construction of the library building, which is the pride of the country.

We are concerned about the government's earlier decision to suspend the construction of the Nepal National Library and have raised suspicion to the negative attitude of the government towards intellectual activity and development. We believe that this has had a negative impact on the public as well. Therefore, it is very important to correct it. For the national identity of Nepal, it is appropriate to build the Nepal National Library at Jamal as most of the countries have national library buildings in the middle of the city. Jamal the heart of the capital is good with transport facilities and is easily accessible to children, elderly, women and specially abled. Such a place in Tundikhel, Ratna Park, which can kill even a moment's tiredness, is very good for the Nepal National Library. Even if a comprehensive Tundikhel plan is made, the construction of a Nepal National Library here will make that plan more dignified. We also strongly appeal to the Right Honarable Prime Minister and the entire Council of Ministers to decide immediately to expedite all the remaining work activities to start the construction of the Nepal National Library at Jamal as there are more than 50 educational institutions around the place and the library is essential for all educational institutions.

ISBN Collection Database Being Created

TUCL has started creating an International Standard Book Number (ISBN) database of the books received from the writers/publishers as repository collection. The library has been maintaining 'ISBN repository collection' in which two copies of each newly published title are collected and maintained as ISBN collection for this purpose. To create the ISBN collection database since November 2019, ten professional librarians have been deployed for cataloguing, data-entry and other necessary procedures. There are more than fifty thousand books in this collection.

13th Library Day Celebrated

Library day is organized as a day for celebrating libraries, highlighting their importance in today's society. The 13th library day was celebrated on 31st August, 2020 (15th Bhadra, 2077 BS) conducting various online programs due to the pandemic situations of COVID-19. Library day is celebrated throughout the country since 31st August, 2008 (15th Bhadra, 2065 BS) to mark the historical day (establishment of Nepal's first library when decree was promulgated on 15th Bhadra, 1869 BS by then His Majesty King Girbanyuddha Bir Bikram Shah). The main objectives of the celebration are to promote reading habit, foster interest in library use, build knowledge based society, develop habit of using library in teaching-learning process, raise the public awareness on need and importance of library, encourage the establishment of public and community library at local level, help government to formulate various rules and regulations for sustainable functioning of library and library service with international standard, initiate construction and reconstruction of libraries damaged by earthquake and to promote and advocate role and importance of all kinds of libraries, academic institutions and stakeholders.

For preparation and planning for library day celebration, various online meetings were conducted where library lovers participated from countries and abroad. A ministerial level decision formed the main organizing committee under the convenership of Mr. Sanjay Sharma, Secretary of Ministry of Education, Science and Technology (MoEST) for the library day celebration; Mr. Yadab Chandra Niraula, Under Secretary of Library Coordination and Documentation Section of MoEST was the Member Secretary and Nepal National Library, various libraries, library associations, NGOs, INGOs were members of the committee. The meeting selected the theme "Library for Social Transformation" (समाज रुपान्तरणको लागि प्स्तकालय) from suggested themes for this year. Due to the outbreak of COVID-19 pandemic, only few subcommittees were formed to help and coordinate the main committee.

TUCL's New Building Design Improved and Approved

Tribhuvan University has approved the final design of TUCL's new building as submitted by The National Reconstruction Authority, GoN. A letter of approval was sent to the authority on 26th January, 2020. The building design was drawn after several meetings and consultations of the senior officials/architects of the authority with the then Registrar of T.U. 
Online Interaction program on "Traditional/Ayurveda Health System and Home Remedies in the Context of COVID-19"

Considering COVID-19 pandemic RECPHEC organized an "Interaction program on traditional/ ayurveda health system and home remedies in the context of COVID-19" on 5th September, 2020 in association with 13th Library day 2020 Main Organizing Committee, Ministry of Education, Science and Technology (MoEST) and technical support of Nepal Research and Education Network (NREN). Firstly, Ms. Chandra Kiran Shrestha, Senior Program Officer, RECPHEC started program giving brief information of RECPHEC solidarity of library days and the problem created by COVID-19. She welcomed all participants, senior experts, Senior/Librarian, Library activists/lovers and different stakeholders and resource persons. A total of 104 participants joined the interaction program through zoom. She highlighted the objectives of the program. The main objectives of the program were:

- 5. Ayurveda approach to enhance immunity to prevent COVID-19 by Dr Buddhi P Paudel.

After the presentation, the floor was opened for questions and presenters responded the questions. Many participants expressed that the program was worthwhile in this COVID-19 pandemic situation and the information provided are very useful in their daily lives. Dr. Pushpa Raj Poudel, Ayurveda Medical Officer & Information Officer, Hospital Development & Medical Services Division Ministry of Social Development, Province no. 5, Butwal presented paper titled "Public Health Apaproach Ayurveda and Yoga for the Prevention and Control of COVID-19 Pandemic". He shared primarily, how they monitored the corona patients, quarantine and isolation places in different districts & places from the beginning of the lockdown. They worked in a team with Ayurveda medical experts, did research and started treatment including orientation for prevention. The outcome was satisfying and it was felt necessary to prepare treatment guideline for rational use of medicine for COVID-19 treatment from Province no. 5 and handed to government. The second paper entitled "Traditional Medicinal Practices in terms of COVID-19 in Nepal" was presented by Mr. Sumir Kumar Rimal, Vice Chairperson, NTAPS & Managing Director, Suri Herbal Product Industry Pvt. Ltd. He started the paper providing the information of indigenous health practitioners. He provided the indigenous knowledge and treatment system. He provided the list of herbal medicine and medicinal plants available in Himalayan, Mountain and Tarai regions, treatment and prevention for COVID-19. NeLIC Conducted Webinar on e-Resources

Nepal Library and Information Consortium organized a webinar in a topic "Availability of e-Resources in Nepal during Lockdown" on 24th April, 2020. About 40 participants representing the member institutions participated in the webinar. The webinar focused on the difficulties teachers, students and research scholars were facing to access resources due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Most of them who were working from home could have benefitted from easy access to e-resources online however, the scholars could not access such resources due to high subscription cost and those subscribed e-resources were also not accessible due to limited IP based access where users need to be in the office or college and it was not feasible during the lockdown.

The webinar was proved to be fruitful in the sense that presenter Mr. Jagadish Aryal, Secretary of NeLIC offered a solution. He suggested them to create username and password for the users which could be an alternate to IP based access. NeLIC has negotiated to different publishers in that matter and many publishers agreed to provide such provision. Some of them have offered free and open access to their contents for this limited period of global pandemic. To list few of them Cambridge University Press, Oxford University Press, Institute of Physics (IOP), JSTOR have agreed to provide remote access to their content for their users while Duke University Press, Ohio State University Press, University of Michigan Press, John Hopkins University Press, University of Nebraska Press, University of North Carolina Press, Temple University Press and Vanderbilt University Press have provided their contents free.

Press Union Established the Library in the Jail

Nepal Press Union, Dadeldhura established the library in the Dadeldhura district Jail with aim of promoting law literacy.

President of Press Union, Dadeldhura branch said that the Union has separated five thousands five hundred fifty five rupees for establishment of library highlighting on the collection, especially related to law which would help make prisoners gain information/knowledge about laws, rules and regulations. He further stressed on the benefit of such libraries in eradicating the misconceptions of prisoners regarding lawyers as they may think that they have been trapped due to the lawyers' ill-faith. Similarly, Chief of District Government Attorney Office Mr. Prakash Bahadur Bhandari emphasized on need of legal knowledge for prisoners to identify on which fault they are imprisoned and the timespan of their imprisonment. He further stated that the jail is also a kind of rehabilitation centre where they can change their lifestyle.
